



30-31st March 2016 at Hotel Hampi International, Hospet, Karnataka

Sasakawa-India Leprosy Foundation, New Delhi & <u>www.jankalyana.org</u> initiated an intervention with leprosy affected communities of Raichur, Ballari, Hospet and Gadag to empower them so that the service deliveries to these communities are ensured. The 1st phase of the workshop was held on 30th & 31st March 2016 at Hotel Hampi International, Hospet with the participants from all the 4 colonies of North Karnataka. Janakalyan conducted the workshop as resource organisation in addition to mobilising the communities for the said workshop.

The Objectives of the Phase I workshop:

- 1. Need Assessment of each colony (individual) about various social security schemes
- 2. Orientation about prevailing social security schemes of state and central governments
- 3. Prepare a plan of action for 2 months to fill the gaps in availing social security schemes



The program commenced at 10.30 am as arrival of Ballari team delayed while Gadag team joined at 11.30 am. The outcomes of the sessions are documented below-

Session 1: Why & What to achieve through this event?





Sri Hanumantappa, State Leader, Karnataka welcomed all the participants and SILF representative to the workshop. Mr Aftaab Pasha, Communication Officer, SILF briefed the purpose and objectives of the 2-days workshop in his keynote address. Requested all the participants to actively participate and take benefits out of the workshop.

Session 2: Creating a learning environment – an exercise to identify the needs of each participant (pair & share exercise):

An exercise was conducted with all the participants to assess the felt needs of the participants; the pair and share exercise was around the following questions-

- 1) Ask name of your partner
- 2) Which colony does s/he belong to?
- 3) What are the issues in his/her colony?
- 4) What is his/her most important problem?
- 5) How long s/he is living with this problem?
- 6) What efforts did s/he put to overcome it?
- 7) What were the difficulties in overcoming the problem?
- 8) Does s/he want solution this problem?
- 9) What should be done to overcome this problem?
- 10) Who should be doing it? (Issues could be of any type)

All the pairs then shared their learning about their partners; the major issues came out of their discussion were-

- 1) Entitlement to land
- 2) Leakage from roof top
- 3) Employment

However, all of them agreed that though we have put some efforts to resolve these issues but we were not consistent; further, it would be our responsibility in future too to resolve these issues.

Session 3: Macro scenario around us – an exercise to understand the prevailing schemes and mechanisms to avail these:

A group work was conducted to know the following from the participants after the lunch-

- 1) Name any schemes you know, come across, heard about in your place
- 2) Identify for whom the scheme is meant for
- 3) Implementing authorities for these schemes?
- 4) What are the criteria to be eligible for these schemes?
- 5) Are we eligible as per these criteria?
- 6) Did anybody in the group avail the benefits from these schemes?
- 7) Why didn't we avail these benefits?

During the exercise, the colony-wise groups identified almost all the schemes of Government of Karnataka as well as Government of India. It came out that most of them know the schemes guidelines, eligibility criteria but none of them are covered by these schemes. They realised that,






though the schemes are meant for them, it would not automatically come to them but will have to put efforts to avail the benefits of these schemes.

It was also tried to do a matching batching of the issues identified in the previous exercise and the schemes available in the market; it is also realised that for all the issues, there is one or more schemes available. It is only the question of putting efforts and avail the benefits.

Session 4: Presentation on social security schemes and social welfare schemes (to fill the gaps): A brief presentation was made on the schemes social security schemes and welfare schemes of Government of India and Government of Karnataka. Also, the 10-point formula on Problem Solving was presented before the participants as under-



It was planned that after this exercise, a home work shall be given to the participants to do classification and ranking of the identified issues. However, the participants were so enthusiastic that they requested to complete the exercise before break for dinner. Accordingly the classification and ranking exercise was done as the next exercise.

Session 5: Group Exercise – Classification of the needs/issues identified during the day & ranking them:





Colony-wise groups were formed for Raichur, Bellary, Hospet and Gadag to classify the issues identified in the morning exercise into small, medium and big problems. They identified 20 issues in to 3 groups as under –

Small Problems

- 1 Cleanliness
- 2 Play Ground
- 3 Old Age Pension, Widows Pension, Physically Handicapped Pension
- 4 Street lights
- 5 Drunkard problems
- 6 Ration Card
- 7 School bus

Medium Problems

- 8 Leakage from roof top
- 9 Drainage system
- 10 Health Problems
- 11 Community Hall

Big Problems

- 12 Drinking water
- 13 Drainage system
- 14 Toilet
- 15 Land rights/ entitlement
- 16 Anganawadi
- 17 Houses
- 18 Employment
- 19 Compound

All these 20 issues/problems they categorised into 3 groups; then each of the participants were asked to vote any 3 major issues of their choice on the board. The following 3 issues came up as the most important issues with maximum votes-

- 4) Entitlement to land
- 5) Leakage from roof top
- 6) Employment

With this, the day was called as a good day with a request to think how to resolve these issues.

The groups were formed mixing the participants from all the colonies in each group. There were 3 groups to discuss small, medium and big problems each. Session 7: Strategies to achieve these in 2 months – Mock Exercise:

The participants shared their outcomes through a mock exercise through role play. The target was how to address their issues even if the officer harasses them time in again. The groups were very innovative in getting their works done though the officers were also playing difficult. They even invited the officers/ public representatives to their colonies to felicitate them so that they can get their works done through him/her. They also used many other tools and techniques to get their issues resolved. They got confidence that now they know how to address their issues and promised that at least 10 issues they will resolve in next 2 months. The mock exercises were played as under -

- 1) Assume role of a public servant, beneficiaries, public representatives, family members, etc.
- 2) Round 1: Share your experience of getting a small work done from public servant (may be failure also)
- 3) Round 2: How it could have been done better to achieve faster and easier results in case of medium issues
- 4) Round 3: How to resolve the common issues/ big issues

Session 8: Team Building, Responsibility & Resource sharing plan:

Team building presentation and exercise was done in the following session to tell them about the situational leadership concept by understanding the core competencies of each other. All of them need to help others to realize their common goals. Each one of them shall assume one role and resolve that with the help of all others. Resources need to be shared by all of them.

The workshop was concluded with the concluding remarks of Mr Aftaab Pasha followed by Sri Siddhu Pujari, Smt Prema Pujari, Sri Basavarajaiah Swamy, Sri Hanumantappa and vote of thanks by Prasen Raptan.

After the lunch at 3.00 pm, the participants were taken to local site seeing at Pampa Sarovar, Anjana Hill and Virupakshi Temple of Kiskindhya.
